In 2022, it will be celebrated on Sunday, 23 October It's a moment of grace to express solidarity with our brothers and sisters in Christ who are living in situations of poverty, violence and oppression. Every parish, school and community is invited to join this special event, and every penny, pound and prayer you give to Missio helps missionaries everywhere continue their work.

'You shall be my witnesses' (Acts 1:80)

An extract from the Holy Father's Message for World Mission Sunday. The full text is available at mission.org.uk/wms

'Dear Brothers and Sisters, these words were spoken by the Risen Jesus to his disciples just before his Ascension into heaven, as we learn from the Acts of the Apostles: 'You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria and to the ends of the earth' (1:8)

'You shall be my witnesses' – The call of every Christian to bear witness to Christ This is the central point, the heart of Jesus' teaching to the disciples, in view of their being sent forth into the world. The disciples are to be witnesses of Jesus, thanks to the grace of the Holy Spirit that they will receive. Wherever they go and in whatever place they find themselves. Christ was the first to be sent, as a 'missionary' of the Father (cf. Jn 20:21), and as such, he is the Father's 'faithful witness' (cf. Rev 1:5). In a similar way, every Christian is called to be a missionary and witness to Christ. And the Church, the community of Christ's disciples, has no other mission than that of bringing the Gospel to the entire world by bearing witness to Christ. To evangelize is the very identity of the Church.

Missionaries of Christ are not sent to communicate themselves, to exhibit their persuasive qualities and abilities or their managerial skills. Instead, theirs is the supreme honour of presenting Christ in words and deeds, proclaiming to everyone the Good News of his salvation, as the first apostles did, with joy and boldness.

In evangelization, then, the example of a Christian life and the proclamation of Christ are inseparable. One is at the service of the other. They are the two lungs with which any community must breathe, if it is to be missionary. This kind of complete, consistent and joyful witness to Christ will surely be a force of attraction also for the growth of the Church in the third millennium. I exhort everyone to take up once again the courage, frankness and parrhesía of the first Christians, in order to bear witness to Christ in word and deed in every area of life.

The need to stand alongside our missionaries in prayer and solidarity has never been so urgent and necessary. In many areas of the world, they will be the first to respond to the physical and spiritual needs of our sisters and brothers who are suffering'

#### Exmouth Food Bank October 2022 News



#### This month

September saw another significant increase in the amount of people turning to the Food Bank for help, particularly those with large families where demand has risen by a further 34%.

In total we distributed 288 parcels to feed 716 individuals – this is more than anything we experienced during the pandemic. The cost of living crisis is biting in and behind these statistics lie real people, facing real hardship. Thankfully, the community of Exmouth continues to rally and we continue to be well supported with monetary and food donations.

#### **Help for Heroes**

Exmouth Food Bank has been approached by the Help for Heroes Community Recovery Services Team who meet with veterans in Exmouth once a month to provide medical, physical, emotional, and financial advice. The team has noticed that the cost of living situation is impacting on veterans whose pride comes first and who will not ask for help regarding food.



We are delighted to be able to help such a great cause and in September provided the team with seven parcels to distribute to veterans in need. We look forward to continuing to work with Help for Heroes each month.


